Alexander Paul Kollmann entered his heavenly home far too soon on August 17, 2025. He was born on July 23, 2013, to his loving parents, Nathan and Jackie Kollmann.

Alex was the third child in the family, and it didn't take long for everyone to figure out that Al was one of those kids who marched to the beat of a different drum—one he likely built or modified himself. His tagline quickly became: "Just Al doing Al things!"

Alex loved to collect all sorts of things, with a special fascination for World War II and other Army memorabilia.

He loved riding his moped around the block and all who saw him admired his army helmet with his mullet blowing in the breeze—his unmistakable signature look.

He was never afraid to try new things, whether it was sushi from the Chinese restaurant or an old, expired MRE from his latest thrift store trip.

Alex was always the kid trying to make others laugh and had the spirit of an old soul. Most who knew him would describe him as an old man in a 12-year-old's body—full of wisdom beyond his years.

He could often be found tinkering in the scrap pile on the family farm, the latest being a lawn mower he planned to modify with a pulley swap to make it go even faster. He was an exceptional skid loader and forklift operator, often figuring out how things worked just through observation.

Alex was baptized on August 11, 2013, at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in

Oakfield, where he also attended school from 3K through this year when he was set to start 7th grade. A naturally bright kid, Alex had all the makings of a straight-A student—but true to form, he preferred to do school his own way, applying just enough effort to get by. He applied that same mentality to the spring cross country meet and will be remembered as the kid who pulled a juice box out of his pocket mid-race for a quick drink. He believed life was too short to hurry it, and preferred to take a more relaxed approach, making sure he thoroughly enjoyed every minute.

He will be deeply missed by all who were lucky enough to know and love him.
