Alice L. Gundelach, 95, formerly of Fond du Lac, entered eternal rest on Wednesday, July 14, 2010, at Beehive Home, Hurricane, Utah, where she had been a resident since 2007. She was born on October 4, 1914, in the Town of Merton, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, a daughter of the late Andrew P. and Anna A. Krueger Lund. Alice was a graduate of Hartland High School and attended vocational school. On April 8, 1939, she married Chester Larson and together they had two sons, Stuart and Warren. He preceded her in death on October 10, 1978. On January 5, 1980, she married Vernon E. Gundelach. He preceded her in death on April 4, 2007.
