He became dearly loved and sought out as Arnie had a way to connect with people as only Arnie could.

As an animal lover, his cats Martin and Sisú ruled the house and Arnie's heart. He was so grateful to have friends adopt them and provide loving homes.

He attended Essential Rock Church in Fond du Lac, where he served on the security team. He was encouraged by their focus of helping the lost and hurting in the community find faith in Jesus. He wanted everyone to know the hope and peace he found when he gave his life to Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. "Tell people I was a real jerk, but because of Jesus I wasn't as bad as I used to be"

In his last days, he could be found studying scripture, listening to Christian music, watching reruns of Bonanza, Star Trek, NCIS...and laughing as he'd watch WWE Friday Night Smack Down trying to convince anyone he could it was real wrestling.

We will miss his snarky humor, blunt honesty, unique perspective, and quirky ways.
