December 11, 1948 - December 2, 2024

Bernard "Butch" Hagen, 75, of Fond du Lac, passed away unexpectedly on December 2, 2024.

Butch was born on December 11, 1948, in Park Falls, WI, to the late Leo and Amalia (Weber) Hagen. After graduating from Campbellsport High School in 1967, he went on to work for the Soo Line Railroad as a switchman. On December 5, 1970, he was united in marriage to Sue Roehl at Immanuel Trinity Lutheran Church in Fond du Lac.

Butch was a proud veteran serving in the U.S. Army from March 1969 to October 1970, including a 13-month tour in Vietnam.

He loved spending time at his property hunting and out in his boat fishing. Many happy hours were spent with Sue fishing together. He shared his love and knowledge of these experiences with his sons and grandchildren for whom his love had no bounds. He learned all he knew from his father.

Survivors include his wife Sue, two sons: Greg and Dan (Rachael) Hagen; eight grandchildren: Chase (Ally), Seth, Brea, Gage, Reese, Kyracylyn, and Kayda Hagen, and Taryn Immel; two great-grandsons: Jaxon and Cal Hagen; he is also survived by his sisters-in-law: Janice (Robert) Fauska and JoAnn Roehl; many nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.

Preceding him in death were his parents, siblings: Evelyn, LaVern, Marvin, and Lyall Hagen, Geraldine (Marvin) Dehring, and Darlene Oelerich, and his father and mother-in-law: Leo and Irene Roehl.

In keeping with his wishes, there will be no visitation. A private family service

will be held. Cremation has taken place. A Celebration of Life gathering will be held at a later date.
