October 18, 1940 - March 7, 2014

Betty L. Schroeder, 73, of Fond du Lac, went to her heavenly home on Friday, March 7, 2014, at Deerview Meadows Assisted Living, Fond du Lac. She was born on October 18, 1940, in the Town of Carson, Portage County, a daughter of Fred and Evelyn Saltzwadel Schroeder.
