Bradley "Brad" J. Kiczula, 70, of Fond du Lac, died on Monday, March 11, 2024, at Whispering Pines in Ripon.

He was born on July 1, 1953, in Chicago, IL, the son of Richard and Patricia Sullivan Kiczula. He was a graduate of L.P. Goodrich High School. He was a United States Army veteran, serving in Vietnam from 1971-1976. On August 11, 1979, he married Wendy R. Zimmerman at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Fond du Lac.

Brad drove for Johnson Bus for over 30 years. He enjoyed fishing, going supper clubbing, loved to cook, driving and taking day trips. He was very lucky at winning radio phone-in contests. Brad loved being with his family. Brad was an extremely proud father and best friend to his only child, Jessika. Brad also had the pleasure of meeting his first granddaughter, Phelix who he loved and admired whole-heartedly for the year that they spent together.

A Vietnam Veteran who valiantly served a country that denied him the benefits and recognition that he deserved. Despite this, Brad was very proud of his service to the United States Army. Brad and his daughter, Jessika adventured to Washington D.C. through the Stars and Stripes Honor Flight in 2019 to reflect on and celebrate his time served.
