Bruce C. Stanke, 78, of Fond du Lac, died on Wednesday, July 23, 2025, at Serenity Villa Assisted Living in Campbellsport.

He was born on December 10, 1946, in Fond du Lac, the son of Charles E. and Joyce Schacht Stanke. He was a graduate of L.P. Goodrich High School, Class of 1965. He was a veteran of the United States Air Force, and was stationed in Germany from 1966 – 1969. On July 1, 1988, he married Marlene G. Goldapske, in Fond du Lac.

Bruce worked as a fireman for the Fond du Lac Fire Department from 1970 – 1991, when he retired. He was a member of Eagles Aerie #270 in Fond du Lac. Bruce enjoyed hunting, trap shooting (even making his own shells), fishing, loved boating, watching NASCAR and the Green Bay Packers. He loved watching hunting shows and was proud of his 500lb black bear he shot. Bruce loved socializing, spending time with his family, watching the grandkids sporting events, and he looked forward to old fashion cocktail hours with Marlene.

Bruce was a far different personality than I was but we were the best of friends in-spite of the differences. Certain things or events did split us up on some occasions, Bruce was just a bit more daring than I was. He got it from his mom who was quite fun who died far too young. She was the one who encouraged me to date my wife Barbara. Her words were, "Bill you need to hussle up Barb Gustin. True story.

During college Barb and I met, dated, engaged and then married. So the drift began but the best friends part did remain. We moved to Minneapolis and then off to South Dakota for 11 years. Then back to Wisconsin but still far apart from Crivitz and Fond du lac. We had dinner on some occasions with he and Marlene which were wonderful get togethers.

I also recall Bruce telling me in so many words that he was proud of Eric and his family along with his hunting expeditions to Illinois getting the big bucks. He said Eric had great job with AT&T I think it was.

All through the years, Bruce never failed to call me on my birthday.

We also talked by phone one or two times a year to catch up. I remember talking to him one day shortly after his heart condition which was total surprise. Bruce and I and Barb last met Bruce last April at Campbellsport. I noticed a difference but we talked close to an hour, as I recall, and reminisced over many good times in dad's garage. "Bill do remember when you did this or that or fixed this or that etc etc.

All in all, we were so so different and yet he was one of the most faithful school friends that stayed in touched all those years. I will never forget Bruce, he was a genuine friend indeed!
