Charles "Chuck" C. Cutler, 83, of Fond du Lac, died Tuesday, October 11, 2016, at Grancare Nursing Home. He was born on November 17, 1932, in Fond du Lac, a son of Frank and Lenore Dreifuerst Cutler. Chuck was a graduate of Fond du Lac Senior High School, Class of 1951. Chuck served with the United States Army from March 1952- March 1954, and served with the National Guard. On December 5, 1954, he married Beverly "Bev" D. Lemke at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, North Fond du Lac. She preceded him in death on March 5, 2016.
