Daniel R. Arndt, 64, of W4370 Highway 23, Fond du Lac, died Monday, April 9, 2007, at home. He was born on June 5, 1942, in the Town of Osceola, Wisconsin, a son of Raymond J. and Elvera E. Guell Arndt. Daniel was a graduate of Campbellsport High School, Class of 1960, where he excelled at football. He attended the Farm and Industry short course at UW-Wisconsin. He was a 4-H and FFA member and exhibited dairy cattle at the Fond du Lac County Fair for many years. He also bred and consigned cattle for sale both locally and abroad. He was a long time member of Holstein-Friesian Association and proud of the many quality Holstein cattle he raised. He also worked in the family milk hauling business. Daniel was a member of Tabor United Methodist Church, Eden. He is survived by a sister: Betty (Bruno) Yunker of Wauwatosa; three brothers: Richard (LaNora) Arndt of Fond du Lac, Dave (Dolores) Arndt of DeForest, Wisconsin, Lee Arndt (friend Donna), of Appleton; nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents. A memorial service will be at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, April 13, 2007, at Tabor United Methodist Church, Rt. 1, Church Road, Eden, with Rev.
