Delores (Dolly) Stuebs, 92 of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin passed away at home on Tuesday, October 29, 2024.

Dolly was born on October 19, 1932, and celebrated her 92nd birthday! She was born at St. Agnes Hospital in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, the fourth daughter of Arthur and Adela (Fischer) Isken. Growing up during the Depression with eight children in her household, she, like all her siblings, learned the value of hard work at a very young age. Dolly lost her father at age 10 and helped to raise her siblings while keeping their household afloat. Her work ethic and compassion to care for others was something she never lost. She even stated recently maybe she should pick up a part-time job so she could help others out. Dolly kept an absolutely meticulous household and always made sure there was a hot meal on the table and prided herself on still being able to do this at her age.

Dolly graduated from Lomira High School. She was united in marriage to David Stuebs on July 9, 1960, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Lomira, Wisconsin. Dolly worked at Sears, Roebuck & Co. in customer service & sales and worked a second job at the local canning factory to help provide for her family. She later went on to work in the business office at Taycheedah Correctional Institution and finished her career at St. Agnes Hospital Food Service. Dolly loved to talk with people and everyone knew her for how friendly she was. Dolly stayed working into her mid-70s and always had the warmest smile and laugh for anyone who needed it.

Dolly was a member of Church of Our Saviour for 40+ years and held multiple volunteer roles at the church. She loved to help coordinate events and enjoyed working on committees including the 'funeral committee'. She was known for the amazing brownies, deviled eggs, and cheesy potatoes she made. She loved to decorate, especially for the holidays. She prided herself on a well-groomed yard with beautiful flower beds throughout the summer. Dolly is survived by her husband Dave, of 64 years. Her two sons: Tim (Julie) Stuebs of Fond du Lac, WI, and Jeff (Patti) Stuebs of Campbellsport, WI; and daughter Pamela (Jeff) Hencke of De Pere, WI.
