January 2, 1934 - October 31, 2014

Donald J. Seefeld, 80, of Fond du Lac, passed away on Friday, October 31, 2014, at Hospice Home of Hope, as a result of Parkinson's Disease and a brain tumor. He was born on January 2, 1934, in Fond du Lac County, a son of Alvin and Helen Weasler Seefeld. He resided in the Campbellsport area until his marriage. He attended St. Matthew's Grade School and graduated from Campbellsport High School in 1952. Donald served with the United States from 1954-1956 during the Korean Conflict. On March 2, 1954, he married Doris Grahl at Tabor United Brethren Church, Eden. After training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, the couple moved to Sault Sainte Marie, Michigan as an army specialist on the Sault Locks. They moved to Eden and he was briefly employed at Mercury Marine. After a few months, he went to work at Giddings & Lewis, where he stayed for 31 years as an electrician. In between, he was an electrician and owned mobile home parks around the state. He enjoyed bowling and was an avid hunter. Donald was a member of Tabor United Methodist Church, Eden. Dad was a man of many talents. He could fix anything and could sell sand in the desert. He was a man of few words, "We bid you a heartfelt good-bye as we shut the door on your earthly life and open the door of heaven's gate". He is survived by his wife, Doris; four children: Wendy (Gary) Mellgren of Waukesha, Karen (Mark) Holzmann, Sheila (Robert) Roehl, and David (Laura) Seefeld, all of the Fond du Lac area; eight grandchildren: Tom (Jamie) Miller, Dan Miller, Renee (B.J.) in-law, Brian Miller.
