Earl W. Averbeck, 89, of Fond du Lac, passed away peacefully into God's presence, on Sunday, March 5, 2017, at Woodlands Senior Park. All of his dreams and expectations came to fruition and he was thankful to God for it all. Earl was a lifelong member of Covenant United Methodist Church and was involved in various church committees. He was involved in Dairy Association Boards, Associated Milk Producers, and the Town of Friendship Planning Commission. He loved the Packers and Brewers and spending time with his family.
