Elizabeth H. Snyder, 94, of 597 Kingswood Avenue, Fond du Lac, died Tuesday, May 18, 2010, at Hospice Home of Hope, Fond du Lac. She was born on August 9, 1915, in Fond du Lac, a daughter of the late Charles L. and Percy R. Menner Higgins. On October 3, 1933, she married Richard J. Snyder. Together they had 14 children.
