



Ellen Marie Isensee

January 19, 1944 - June 20, 2021

Ellen Marie (Hanson) Isensee, 77, died peacefully on June 20, 2021, with her final days surrounded by her family. Ellen was born on January 19, 1944 in Minneapolis, MN, daughter of Edward Winter and Mary Alice (Richards) Hanson. She grew up in Welsh Valley and Daneville, near Cataract, WI and graduated from Sparta High School in 1962. She graduated from Madison Area Technical College with a LPN degree, and her first job was at Mendota State Mental Hospital.

Ellen married Wallace Spencer Isensee on August 21, 1965 at Sparta Methodist Church, officiated by Rev. Virgil Nulton. Ellen and Wally moved several times due to his Air Force career and education, living and working in Rantoul, IL, Minot, ND, and Platteville, WI. They moved to Columbus, WI, where they were blessed with a son, Scott Wallace, on March 7, 1974. They lived in Berrien Springs, MI for a few years before moving to the Fond du Lac area, where Ellen worked at Nazareth Heights. They moved to Madison, WI, where Ellen cared for extended family and worked at Four Winds Manor in Verona. They returned back to Fond du Lac, in June 1992, where Ellen worked at Fond du Lac Lutheran Home. She finished out her career at St. Francis Home after 45 years of nursing.

Ellen and Wally enjoyed visiting and assisting many neighbors and friends in the area. Ellen has been an active member of United Methodist churches in the various communities where they resided. At Salem United Methodist Church, she has been active in Morning Glory Circle, Bible Study, Loaves & Fish and numerous church events. Ellen is well known for her card and letter writing with her church family and her own family and friends. Ellen and Wally enjoyed traveling all over the United States and to Germany. They also enjoyed camping, family and school reunions, genealogy, dancing, and cheering on Brewers, Packers, Badgers and Bucks.
