Gerhardt Walter Mueller, 94, of Fond du Lac, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, October 27, 2020, at his home. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints. Psalm 116:15.

He was born on December 12, 1925, in Green Bay, the son of German immigrant parents Paul and Margaret Naesar Mueller. He was baptized and confirmed in his Christian faith, graduated with a Lutheran teaching degree and spent his life witnessing for his Saviour Jesus Christ: 1 Cor. 6:20 You were bought with a price. On June 26, 1948, he married Bernice I. Mundstock in LaCrosse, WI, and were to be blessed with seven children.
