Glenn H. Demoske (age 81) was welcomed into the arms of his Savior, Jesus, on March 30, 2016. He was born in Waupun on December 1, 1934 to O. E. "Joe" and Alvina "Bonnie" Demoske. He graduated from Fond du Lac High School in 1952 and attended UW-Madison. On November 7, 1954, he married the love of his life Anita M. Hollander at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Fond du Lac. Glenn served in the United States Marine Corps from 1953-1955. He worked at Giddings & Lewis from 1955-1965, then with his dad at Demoske's Marine Supply in Green Lake until 1970. He decided to complete his college education and moved with his wife and three children to Menomonie, WI where he attended UW-Stout. He worked as a foreman at Mercury Marine and then taught at MPTI and retired as an Associate Dean in 1991. Throughout his life, he has enjoyed being in Sea Scouts, rebuilding and driving Corvairs, traveling and making wine (Red Shoe was his label). In his early 70's he took up playing the upright bass and played with the Worship Team at Hope Lutheran Church where he was an active member. He has been a strong Christian influence on his whole family whom he loved very much and he was so proud of them all. His memory is treasured by his survivors: Anita, his beloved wife; two daughters Tasha (Fred) Fink, Marci (Mike) Scharf and daughter-in-law Pam Demoske; his grandchildren Chelsea (Joe) Axtman, Shelby and Shannon Fink, Adam (Kim) Scharf, Kylene (Cameron) Draeger, Erica Scharf, Noah and Jacob (Vickie) Demoske, Krista (Tim) Wichman, and Ben Demoske; thirteen great-grandchildren; sister Carol Dorn and sister-in-
