Gordon D. Cox, 87, a resident of Berlin, died Monday, June 11, 2007, at his home where he resided the last 12 years. He was born on September 28, 1919, in Waukesha, Wisconsin, a son of Carl and Hilda Ranz Cox. Gordon served with the United States Army in Europe and North Africa during World War II. On June 16, 1946, he married Mildred Wendels at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Fond du Lac. Gordon was a barber for over 30 years, first in Pewaukee and later, he owned and operated Gordon's Barber Shop in Fond du Lac. He was a charter member of Luther Memorial Church, Fond du Lac.
