Hubert E. Fenske, 87, a resident of Woodlands Senior Park, Fond du Lac, died Thursday, June 7, 2012. He was born on February 12, 1925, in the Town of Springvale, a son of John A. and Emma E. Quade Fenske. Hubert graduated from Rosendale High School. Hubert served with the United States Army, during World War II, with the 711 Tank Battalion. On June 6, 1959, he married Marilyn D. Jacobs at Redeemer Lutheran Church, Fond du Lac. Hubert was employed for 34 years with the United States Postal Service in Fond du Lac and retired as a rural carrier in St. Cloud. He was a member of Hope Lutheran Church and was a member of the Men's Club. Hubert was also a member of the VFW, DAV, and the American Legion Trier Puddy Post 75. He enjoyed traveling, some of his favorite places were Hawaii, Okinawa, and Alaska. He is survived by two children: Timothy J. Fenske and Cheryl L.
