He was born on August 24, 1919 in Fond du Lac, a son of Frank and Ada Priepeke McCoy. On November 10, 1942, Hugh married Betty Jean Schuchardt, in Fond du Lac. He graduated from Fond du Lac Senior High School, and attended Fountain City Business College, Fond du Lac. Hugh entered the U.S. Army prior to WWII and served for five years. Following his service, he was employed at Wisconsin Power and Light as an engineer for 35 years. Hugh was a member of Covenant United Methodist Church, Fond du Lac. He enjoyed being active in his church, teaching and coordinating Sunday school, as well as contributing his skills in carpentry and maintenance. In his earlier years, he enjoyed camping with his family and hunting. He took carving lessons and loved to carve wildlife. Hugh and Betty both enjoyed dancing and were long time members of a square dancing club. He will be remembered by many for his master carpentry skills. Together with his wife, Betty, he built his home on Forest Avenue.
