John D. Lenburg, age 68, a life-long Fond du Lac resident, died at home Sunday, October 23, 2022.

He attended the Wisconsin School for the Blind and Visually Impaired at Janesville and more recently participated in activities at the Hands On Adult Day Center in Fond du Lac.

He took part in Special Olympics and participated in Very Special Arts programs for many years. John enjoyed singing with the Fond du Lac Area United Singers and was often featured as a soloist at the group's concerts.

John's easygoing personality made it possible for him to enjoy many friendships with the people who assisted him during his lifetime. Watching sports brought a special joy to John, especially when the Packers or the Brewers games were broadcast.

He is survived by his brothers Norman (Bernice) Lenburg Jr., Sun Prairie, and

Robert (Joanne) Lenburg, Madison; niece Amy (Matt Burress) Lenburg of Minneapolis; nephews Marc (Julia Charles) Lenburg of Brookline, Mass., Aaron Lenburg of Quincy, Mass., and Matt Lenburg of Madison; and, four great nieces.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
