Kenneth H. Rose, 85, died Sunday, December 19, 2010, at the Fond du Lac Lutheran Home. He was born on December 13, 1925, in Fond du Lac, a son of Herbert H. and Irmgard E. Immel Rose. He graduated from St. Peter's Ev. Lutheran School and Winnebago Lutheran Academy. Kenneth served with the United States Army in Europe during World War II. He was a member of the Fighting 69th Infantry Division Association. On May 31, 1947, he married Marjean Hageman at St. Peter's Ev. Lutheran Church with Rev. Gerhard Pieper officiating. Kenneth and his family lived in Eden where he owned and operated Community Lumber and Supply and Kenrod Builders. They moved to Fond du Lac in 1968, where he became employed at Fond du Lac Concrete Products. He worked as a salesman and sales manager with Raynor Overhead Doors, and later worked for Badger Auto, retiring in 1989. He was a lifelong member of St. Peter's Ev. Lutheran Church, where he served on the church and school board. He was a firefighter with the Eden Volunteer Fire Department. He was a member of the VFW Post 1904. Kenneth is survived by two daughters: Sue (Gene) Feucht of Fond du Lac, and Terry (John) Wozniak of Phoenix, Arizona; five grandchildren: Katie (Jason) Shively of Oshkosh, Kris (Brian) Krueger of Fond du Lac, Kelly (Josh) Schroeder of Waupaca, Melissa Schwartz of Phoenix, Arizona, and Michael Schwartz of Phoenix, Arizona; a great-granddaughter, Cassidy Vega; two great-grandsons: Caleb Shively and Jacob Krueger; a sister, Carol Batterman of Fond du Lac; nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Marjean
