



Lorry Beth Bond

June 22, 1959 - August 7, 2016

Lorry Beth Bond Age 57, died on August 7, 2016, in Madison, Wisconsin, after a lifelong struggle with congenital hydrocephalus. For the past twenty years she has had progressive MS. Lorry was born on June 22, 1959, in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin to Earl and Elaine (Lepine) Bond. She graduated from L. P. Goodrich High School in January 1977. After working in several office support positions, she returned to the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1983. She graduated with a B. A. in social work and an M.S. in counselor education. She worked briefly as a psychotherapist in Minneapolis before returning to Wisconsin to work in the Department of Corrections, first as a social worker at the Columbus Correctional Institution, then as a probation and parole officer in Madison. In March 1994, she became disabled as a result of the effects of congenital brain damage, and MS. Lorry volunteered for several years at Lakeside Press until suffering the first of two strokes. She was devastated when she learned she could no longer use the medicinal herbs, which she had studied and used for many years. She hated allopathic medicine, but was forced to use it as a result of her MS. It was a very sad time for her. She is survived by her mother; four sisters: Randy (Joe) Aiello, Kerry (Gene) Faris, Debby (Andy) Bond Lorenz, and Amy (Jeff) Shaw; and one brother, Jim (Mary) Bond. She is further survived by many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her brother Tom, her niece, Melanie Bond, her father, Earl Bond, and beloved service dog, Dana. Cremation has taken place. A memorial service will be held on October 2, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. at Friend's
