Mae R. Koshnick, 83, a resident of Fond du Lac, died Sunday, June 6, 2010. She was born on November 26, 1926, in Jewel, Iowa, a daughter of Edward N. and Elsie K. Kraemer Keifenheim. Mae graduated from Fond du Lac Senior High School, Class of 1945. On August 15, 1945, she became employed by National Exchange Bank, where she remained a dedicated employee for over 40 years. In her 40 year tenure with the bank, she held many positions, eventually becoming the first female officer. The customers were always her primary concern. On June 11, 1949, she married Wilfred "Will" F. Koshnick at Immanuel-Trinity Lutheran Church with the Rev. John Becker officiating. Mae was a Life Member of Soroptimist International of Fond du Lac, and was a past member of the National Association of Bank Women. For more than 20 years she served as treasurer of the American Cancer Society and she served as a director on one of the first United Way boards. She enjoyed bowling, golf, working on the class reunion committee, and being involved with the Election Poll. She was a member of Immanuel-Trinity Lutheran Church. Mae is survived by a sister, Colleen J. Hensen; a brother-in-law, Deacon Robert Hensen; a sister-in-law, Joyce Schultz; two aunts: June Diener and Amanda Rumlow; six nieces: Debbie (Jerry) Zasada, Cindy (Peter) Meinholz, Pattie (Michael) LaDue, Kay (Craig) Marple, Ann (Frank) Smyser, and Maureen (John) Mason; a nephew, Wayne (Gayle) Schultz, together with their families.
