Michael "Chunk" L. Haney, 36, of W8651 County Road T, Lamartine, died on Wednesday, November 1, 2006, while doing what he loved, farming. He was born on May 6, 1970, in Waupun, a son of Edward and Marjean Pinno Haney. Mike graduated from Laconia High School in 1988. He then went to work for Michels Pipeline for eight years before starting M&M's Countryside Excavating with his mother. It was said many times that no one could dig a better pond.
