Nathan Paul Schwartz, 43, passed away unexpectedly on February 16, 2022 at his residence. Nathan was born on February 19, 1978 in Madison, Wisconsin, the son of Ralph Stephen Schwartz and Mary Schroeder Huberty.

He was skilled at many trades, learned them quickly and worked mainly in roofing, tile work and home construction for various employers. Nathan had a heart of gold and a kind spirit and struggled with drug addiction for many years recently dealing with the challenges that recovery can bring. He never fully recovered from the unexpected loss of the love of his life, Lena Riederer.

Nathan had a very eclectic love for a broad range of music and acquired a large collection of vinyl as a hobby in recent years. Nathan played dartball and horseshoes in leagues in the city. He was a member of Brothertown Indian Nation. He had a special love for many of his feline pets. His smile could light up a room and his stunning hazel/green eyes could change color based on his mood.

He is survived by his parents, stepfather Robert Huberty, his brother Justin (Sarah Sonsalla), nephews Cole and Logan Schwartz, and step-niece Kiley Wagner. He is further survived by aunts and uncles, Joe Schroeder, Elaine (Duane) Rebek, Sue (Robert) Steinbarth, Mary (Timothy) Klima, Cecelia (Andy) Preston, Tony (Mary) Schwartz and Tess (Mark) Wagner.

He was preceded in death by his paternal and maternal grandparents.

We talked about old times in the 3rd Street hood. He was a kind and smiling soul. Harmless and sweet. He got along with everyone and remained a neutral party to most situations that claimed a side whether in a good debate or in groups of people. He always saw both sides.

Now, I haven't seen Nate for a long time but as friends on social media I watched him share the things he loved and the things that caused him pain. I talked to him privately a few times about those things. I was always worried a bit for him knowing fully his struggle as I've seen it in those I love before. When I saw that he passed I knew what it meant for all of those left behind to now carry the pain he held. That's the crazy thing about this type of loss. His pain is gone but transferred to those he loves. He didn't mean for that to happen. He couldn't have known because he was just trying to figure out how to make his stop. As I sit here typing this his picture is looking right at me smiling away. I don't want to speak for him but I know that he never meant to hurt anyone.

The root was addiction. Addiction doesn't discriminate. There's no doubt in my mind that he did the best he could for as long as he could. I implore each of you reading this to do the same.
