He attended what he likes to call a "Little House on the Prairie" school, a one-room schoolhouse located outside of Oakfield housing grades K-12. In 1972, Nick joined the U.S. Army being stationed in Ft. Leonardwood, MO, Ft. Bliss, TX, Korea, and Ft. Lauderdale, FL. His time spent in the Army deeply shaped his patriotic spirit and outlook on life. In 1977, Nick married Barbara Riegert. Together they raised three boys: Chuck, Cory and Chris.
