March 6, 1930 - April 18, 2008

Raymond L. Thill, 78, of 111 Putnam Street, Oakfield, died unexpectedly on Friday, April 18, 2008, at home. He was born on March 6, 1930, in Oakfield, a son of Harvey A. and Edna Knoll Thill. Ray served with the United States Army, as a sergeant, in the artillery division, during the Korean War from 1951-1953. On April 14, 1951, he married Mary Jane Bowe at United Methodist Church, Lamartine. They lived on the family farm on Highway Y in Oakfield for 13 years and Lamartine for 40 years before moving to Oakfield in 2004. He was employed with the Lamartine Creamery, CW Transport, Hawthorn Melody Dairy, and Tractor-Trailer Leasing before joining Mercury Marine, where he retired in 1995. Ray was a member of United Methodist Church and the Lamartine Volunteer Fire Department. He was also a member of the Oakfield VFW Post 8092, the Teamsters Union Local 200 for 16 years, and the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, Winnebago Lodge 1947.
