May 8, 1945 - March 19, 2008

Robert James “Baldy” “Bicycle Bob” Holterman, 62, formerly of Fond du Lac, died Wednesday, March 19, 2008, at Wisconsin Veterans Home in King, Wisconsin. He was born on May 8, 1945, in Fond du Lac, a son of Nathan R. and Elizabeth A. Large Holterman. Robert proudly served with the United States Army in Korea and Vietnam from April 30, 1963 to April 23, 1966. As a sniper, he was recognized many times for his excellent marksmanship. On August 30, 1969, he married Kathleen K. Guell. Bob worked at Oakfield Brick, International Paper, Holiday Gas, Lauers Grocery Store, and Zephyr Gas. He volunteered at St. Agnes Hospital for many years and at other community establishments.
