Robert A. Lewis, 90, of Fond du Lac, passed away on Wednesday, October 15, 2025, at his residence.

He was born on April 17, 1935, in Atlanta, GA, the son of Asa A. and Neolia D. Carter Lewis. Robert attended school in Crystal City, Missouri. At the age of 17, Robert joined the United States Coast Guard and served for four years. He went to MSOE and while in school there met his future wife Janet Mayer, who was a student at Columbia Hospital School of Nursing. Robert graduated MSOE with a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering. On December 20, 1958, he married Janet C. Mayer, in Sheboygan, WI.

Robert worked his way up in the company at Giddings and Lewis during his 31 years there, serving as Vice President up until his retirement. He loved bowling and golf and was active in both leagues until he was well into his 80's.
