



## Robert H. Sharratt

January 14, 1923 - July 3, 2009

Robert H. Sharratt, 86, a resident of the Fond du Lac Lutheran Home, died Friday, July 3, 2009, at Hospice Home of Hope. He was born on January 14, 1923, in Fond du Lac, a son of Harvey and Ruth Dodd Sharratt. Robert served with the United States Army during World War II as a Tank Unit Commander, receiving the American Theatre Ribbon, A-P Theatre Ribbon, and a Victory Medal. Bob graduated from UW-Madison in 1949. On June 25, 1949, he married Mary Elizabeth Stollfus in Fond du Lac. In 1962, the couple moved to Petaluma, California, where they resided for 46 years. Robert was employed there with the City and County of San Francisco. Robert was a former member of Immanuel-Trinity Lutheran Church, Fond du Lac, and Elim Lutheran Church while residing in California. He enjoyed gardening, golfing, traveling, and most of all, visiting his family. He is survived by his wife, Mary Elizabeth; four children: Brian (Cindy) Sharratt of Eldorado, Brenton (Debbie) Sharratt of Pullman, Washington, Patricia Gilardi of Eugene, Oregon, Margaret (Eric) Salmassy of Millcreek, Washington; 10 grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; a brother, Warren (Roseann) Sharratt of Denver, Colorado; and a sister, Burnett (Bruce) Watson of Vermont.
