ViAnne Karen (Howell) Nelson, age 79, passed away on the evening of December 4, 2023, surrounded by her loving family.

ViAnne was born on January 3, 1944, to Harry Howell and Lova (Vespermen) Hanson. She was the sixth of seven children and grew up in the Madison area.

She married her husband, Frank Nelson, on January 21, 1962. They lived and started their family in McFarland, where they had their first two children, Teah and Wendy. Years after her first love Frank passed away, Vianne reconnected with an old childhood friend, Carl. Though the time was far too short, the two spent many years together traveling the country, snow-birding in Mesa, Arizona, and doing what they loved most, spending time with each other's families.

In her younger years, Vianne worked at Associated Physicians, and later as a Human Resources Secretary for the Wisconsin Department of Corrections, where she spent 15 years loving her work and making many lifelong friends at the Taycheedah Correctional Institution.

She was a daughter, sister, mother, wife, friend, girlfriend, grandmother, great grandmother, dog mom, neighbor, and professional ball-buster.
